No person shall keep any roosters.

No person shall slaughter any chickens.

No person shall engage in the commercial production of eggs.

If the requirements of Title 3 Chapter 1 (see attached) of the Municipal Codes are not complied with, the City may revoke any permit granted and/or initiate prosecution for a civil infraction violation. A person who has been issued a permit shall submit it for examination upon demand by any police officer or code enforcement officer. Notwithstanding the issuance of a permit by the City, private restrictions on the use of the property shall remain enforceable and take precedence over a permit. Private restrictions include but are not limited to deed restrictions, condominium master deed restrictions, neighborhood association by-laws, and covenant deeds. A permit issued to a person whose property is subject to private restrictions that prohibit the keeping of chickens is void. The interpretation and enforcement of the private restriction is the sole responsibility of the private parties involved.

I understand the above restrictions on the permit and am submitting this application in compliance with Title 3, Chapter 1 of the Municipal Code of the City Paris.

This Permit must be renewed annually on or before January 31st. A person who wishes to continue keeping chickens shall obtain a new permit before the expiration date. Application for a new permit shall be pursuant to the procedures and requirements that are applicable at the time the person applies for a new permit.
